Blue Wave Harmony Returning to Inter-Island Service Today

The Port Authority of Trinidad and Tobago (PATT) advises that international classification surveyors (commonly referred to as “class”) have cleared the vessel *Blue Wave Harmony* and it is returning to inter-island operations today.

All repair works on the vessel have been fully inspected, passed, and certified by the relevant international class surveyors and flag state administration. The vessel has received the required approvals to resume service. PATT reiterates that the *Blue Wave Harmony* is returning to service having met all required international safety, regulatory, and certification standards.

As part of the final phase before entering commercial operations, the *Blue Wave Harmony* will undergo further sea trials with cargo, including all goods above 7000kgs, construction materials, dangerous goods, and livestock.

Following the completion of these sea trials, the *Blue Wave Harmony* will enter full commercial service on the inter-island sea bridge.

The vessel is scheduled to:

- Depart Port of Spain at 2:00 p.m.
- Depart Scarborough at 11:00 p.m.

The return of the *Blue Wave Harmony* represents a further strengthening of capacity on the inter-island sea bridge, as service levels continue to increase. When the vessel resumes full commercial service it will be supported by:

- **Buccoo Reef** – approximately 1,000 passengers and over 180 vehicles
- **APT James** – approximately 900 passengers and up to 150 vehicles
- **Galleons Passage** – approximately 400 passengers and around 60 vehicles

With capacity for approximately 125 freight units, nearly 2,000 metres of cargo lanes, refrigerated cargo support, and overnight passenger accommodation, the *Blue Wave Harmony* significantly enhances both cargo and passenger movement on the sea bridge.

PATT thanks the travelling public, businesses, and stakeholders for their patience and understanding and remains focused on maintaining safe, reliable inter-island connectivity.
